Purpose

The FRIENDS Emblem is an adult recognition program sponsored by the Friends Committee on Scouting, an affiliate of Friends World Committee for Consultation, Section of the Americas. The purpose of this program is to recognize adult Friends for their outstanding contributions to the spiritual and social development of our Young Friends through Quaker programs and through the Scouting and/or Guiding programs.

The Emblem

The FRIENDS Emblem incorporates an eight-pointed star, known as the *Quaker Star*, with a scriptural quotation central to Quaker beliefs, “*A light that shines in the dark.*” The red and black Quaker star dates back to work performed by English Friends during the Franco-Prussian War of 1872. It has long been associated with Quaker relief service worldwide. The scriptural passage comes from the first chapter of the Gospel of John, fifth verse. It refers to the light of God, which shines in all humanity.

Eligibility

The Friends Emblem may be presented to any recorded adult Friend who is currently registered with the Boy Scouts of American, Girl Scouts of the USA, Camp Fire USA Inc., Scouts Canada, Girl Guides Canada or a Scouting and/or Guiding program outside of the United States or Canada and are rendering service to our Young Friends through one or more of these programs.

Standards of Evaluation

The following guidelines are used to evaluate nominees:

1. Supports instruction and spiritual nurture in the family.
2. Gives significant service to local Friends Meeting/Church, particularly in leadership positions.
3. Demonstrates a Quaker example that is highly regarded by others in the local Friends Meeting/Church.
4. Encourages youth to participate in Scouting and/or Guiding programs, as well as religious growth programs.
5. Provides leadership in local, district, regional or national Scouting and/or Guiding program(s).
6. Is recognized by leaders in Scouting and/or Guiding program(s) as a person of exemplary character and integrity, consistent with Quaker values and heritage.

NOTE: work accomplished and dedication, rather than a specific number of years' service, should be the criteria for receiving this emblem. However, it is assumed that the nominee has tenure of consistent service and intends to continue.

ALL information should be typed and submitted in English.

Resume of Candidate's Activities

Submit a separate resume of the nominee's Meeting/Church and Scouting and/or Guiding program(s) involvement using an outline form. The following elements must be included:

1. Monthly Meeting/Church
 - a) Name and address (postal and email) of Meeting or Church
 - b) Name and address (postal and email) of Clerk/Pastor or local Meeting leader
 - c) Service rendered and tenure in leadership positions
2. Scouting and/or Guiding Programs(s) (Please submit separate information for ALL programs)
 - a) Name and address (postal and email) of group(s)
 - b) Name and address (postal and email) of supervisor in the organization(s)
 - c) Past and present leadership positions
 - d) Leadership training courses attended as a learner or instructor
 - e) Youth and adult awards received for service to the organization(s)
3. Other Service Experience (Please submit separate information for ALL Service Organizations)
 - a) Name and address (postal and email) of organization(s)
 - b) Name and address (postal and email) of supervisor(s)
 - c) Description of nature of services rendered
4. References
 - a) List two additional references from Monthly Meeting/Church who may be contacted to verify information sent
 - a. Name and addresses (postal and email) for each
 - b) List two additional references from Scouting and/or Guiding organization(s) who may be contacted to verify information sent
 - a. Name and addresses (postal and email) for each
 - c) List two additional references for each service experience organization who may be contracted to verify information sent
 - a. Name and addresses (postal and email) for each

Letters of Recommendation

Submit letters of recommendation from the following:

1. Clerk/Pastor or other representative of either Monthly Meeting, Quarterly, Yearly Meeting, national or international Quaker body of which candidate is a member or attendee. List information on candidate's participation in worship life, programs and other services rendered.
2. Knowledgeable and influential adult at the council, regional, national or international level of the Scouting and or Guiding program(s), or any other organization(s). Cite service of the candidate as an adult volunteer, trainings taken and adult awards received.

Review Procedure

Approval of the Friends Emblem is not automatic and is not done by an administrator. Approval is done by the Friends Emblem Review Committee, an international committee, which reviews all the material, reflects, and consults before approval. One should expect to allow 3 to 4 weeks for committee approval not including time for mailing and shipping and perhaps longer if the application is incomplete or the committee has questions that need additional information from the nominator or anyone who has submitted supporting documentation. International orders should allow up to 6 weeks for approval, and longer for shipping – depending on distance.

The following steps will be used to process a nomination for the FRIENDS Emblem:

1. Upon receipt, the Clerk, the nomination will be checked for legibility and completeness. If deficiencies are noted, the nominator will be contacted and asked to correct them. Processing will begin only when a nomination is complete.
2. The nomination is then sent to the Friends Emblem Review Committee for evaluation. If any additional information is needed, the Committee will request it. A recommendation to recognize or not recognize the application is subsequently made.
3. The nominator will be notified of the Friends Emblem Review Committee's decision.
 - a) If the nominee is to be recognized, the Clerk will contact the nominator and request the appropriate fees. Current fees may be found on the Friends Committee on Scouting website or by contacting the Clerk.
 - b) Once the appropriate fees have been received by the Clerk, the recognition and certificate will be sent to the nominator for presentation.
 - c) If the nominee is not to be recognized, the nominator will be sent a brief report outlining the reasons for the decision. The judgment of the Friends Emblem Review Committee is final. However, the nominator may resubmit the candidate's name at a later date.

Presentation Suggestions

The nominator(s) should consult with the Overseers of the local Friends Meeting/Church to determine the best manner for presenting the FRIENDS Emblem to the successful nominee. This presentation may take place during Monthly Meeting for Business, Meeting for Worship, or during another Meeting/Church event in which a large number of the membership are present.

The local Friends Meeting/Church may also wish to present or recognize the successful nominee during an appropriate Scouting and/or Guiding event, such as a District, Council or National recognition program/dinner. A brief write-up of the nominee's service to youth should additionally be submitted to the local organization's publication and any other newspaper of local interest. Copies of any printed accounts should be forwarded to the Friends Committee on Scouting.

Presentation should be brief and simple in nature. The *Friends Emblem* recognition is placed around the neck of the recipient by the nominator. Service to Quaker youth should be stressed, so that Young Friends are encouraged to serve their brothers and sisters through the Scouting and/or Guiding programs.

The nomination must include the following:

1. Nomination form.
2. Resume of nominees activities within Religious Society of Friends and Scouting/Guiding.
3. Letter of recommendation from a Quaker body.
4. Resume of nominees activities within all Scouting/Guiding programs they are affiliated with.
5. Letter of recommendation from the Scouting/Guiding organization(s).
6. Resume(s) from other service organizations that the nominee is affiliated with.
7. **Fee for the recognition and the shipping fees will be requested only on successful nominations.**
